Household Garbage

This waste consists of food, books, magazines, packaging, small appliances and tools. All City single family residents will receive twice-a-week pick up for household garbage. Yard waste may no longer be mixed with this waste.



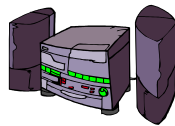
YARD WASTE

Banned from the landfill as of January 1, 1992, this waste consists of grass clippings, leaves, shrubs, and tree trimmings and limbs. Materials should be contained or bundled for easy handling. No limb should be longer than three feet in length with weight restrictions from 40 to 50 pounds.



Recyclables

The City has a recycling program in place. Newspaper, aluminum cans, metal beverage and food cans, all colors of glass bottles, jars, aseptic containers (including drink boxes, milk and juice cartons), and plastic bottles (which previously held liquid), such as water jugs and laundry detergent jugs, are collected. Caps from bottles, jars and jugs should be removed and discarded with household waste.



**Special
Pick-Ups**

**(Furniture/Televisions/
Stereos)**

These items may be placed at the curb for pick-up on the same day that your yard waste is picked up.

No Construction Material

Building and demolition debris, such as fencing, bricks, floor tiles, and doors are not included in the household waste pick-up service.



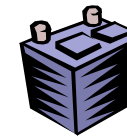
**Household
Hazardous
Waste**

This waste includes lead, acid batteries, gasoline, paints, thinners and solvents, and pool chemicals. These items are harmful to the environment and should not be disposed of with your garbage. The Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility is located at 12100 Young Pine Road in Orlando.



No Motor Oil

Motor oil was banned from the landfill by the State as of October 1, 1988. Motor oil cannot be disposed of in your garbage. All City residents may recycle motor oil at any area oil collection center.



**No Lead
Acid
Batteries**

Lead Acid batteries were banned from the landfill by the State as of October 1, 1989. Retail outlets where you purchase your new battery must accept your old one for proper disposal. Residents may bring batteries to the Orange County Household Hazardous Waste Facility



NO TIRES

Tires were banned from being buried in the landfill by the state as of July 1, 1989. Residents may take typical automobile size tires to the Orange County Hazardous Waste Facility located at 12100 Young Pine Road in Orlando. Use of the facility is free on Wednesday from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm and on Saturday from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm.
